

Daily Report 10/24/16

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 301 calls for service and arrested 9 people.

Theft of Bicycle – 201500004671 – Unit block of College Av – 10/20 at 2pm to 10/21 at 12:15pm: A black Trek bicycle secured with a bicycle lock was stolen from a bicycle rack.

Shooting – 201600004694 – 1300 block of Tyler Av – 10/22 at 1:20pm: Officers responded to the area for reports of shots fired. While officers were on scene they were notified by Anne Arundel Medical Center that a 19 year old male shooting victim arrived at the emergency room. The victim was transported to the University of Maryland Shock Trauma Center in Baltimore with life threatening injuries. A K-9 scan of the area led to five handguns being recovered. One of the guns recovered was reported stolen in Calvert County. Armed Robbery – 201600004702 – 1000 block of Norman Dr – 10/23 at 2:50am: The adult male victim was walking to the parking lot when he was approached by two male suspects. One suspect displayed a handgun and the other displayed a knife. They took the victim's wallet and fled the area on foot.

Burglary – 201600004710 – Unit block of Cambridge Ct – 10/21 from 10am to 10pm: The rear door to the home was forced open and jewelry, camera equipment, and a handgun were stolen.

Assault – 201600004712 – Annapolis Neck Rd – 10/23 at 10:15pm: Anne Arundel County Police Department and Annapolis Police Department are conducting a joint investigation into this incident and Anne Arundel County Police Department will be releasing information to the public about it. When they release information we will share it on Facebook and include it on this daily report.

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash
