In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 107 calls for service and arrested 8 people.

Wanted Subject – Damario Jackson, 21, of Annapolis is currently wanted for attempted murder and related offenses. Robbery - 201600004761 – 200 block of Boxwood Rd - 10/26 at 7:40pm: The 14 year old male victim was sitting at a ground level patio when he was approached by Albert Gross, 22, of Annapolis. Gross asked the victim for money and when the victim replied that he didn't have any money Gross snatched the victim's cell phone from his hand. Gross offered to give the victim his cell phone back in exchange for \$10. The victim contacted a near by adult male family member who gave Gross \$10. Gross did not return the cell phone and started to leave the area. The adult family member grabbed Gross to stop him from leaving with the phone. Gross freed himself and punched the juvenile victim several times. A female neighbor came to intervene in the assault and was also punched by Gross. The victims wrested the cell phone from Gross then he fled the area on foot. Officers located Gross walking on Hilltop La near Edelmar Dr and he matched the victims' description of the suspect. Gross was identified as the suspect. Gross was arrested and when searched was found to have several pills of suspected Xanax in his pocket.

Burglary – 201600004765 – 1100 block of Madison St – 10/26 at 9:50pm to 10/27 at 12:50am: An apparently unlocked apartment was entered and money was stolen.

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash
