In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 100 calls for service and arrested 2 people.

Attempted Motor Vehicle Theft – 201600003867 – Unit Block of Taylor Avenue – 8/31 between 12:30 pm and 2 pm: The vehicle was parked in a lot and the vehicle’s owner could not start the vehicle. The vehicle was towed to a local auto center and it was determined that the ignition was tampered with. No items were reported missing from the vehicle.

Armed Robbery – 201600003870 – Unit Block of Bay Ridge Road – 8/31 at 11:25 pm: An armed suspect entered a store and approached a female employee. The suspect forced the employee in the office where he displayed a handgun and demanded the employee place currency in a bag. The employee put an unknown amount of currency in the bag and the suspect fled the store in an unknown direction.

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that

only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
