

Daily Report 08/19/13

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 282 calls for service and arrested 35 people.

Good News - On 08/16 officers recovered a bicycle that had just been reported stolen. At 5:10pm the bicycle owner reported the theft from the 1700 block of Forest Dr. The bicycle had been left unsecured in front of a business. Officers checked the surrounding area and located the bicycle in the 700 block of Newtowne Dr. A ten year old boy was in possession of the bicycle and as a first time offender was referred to the Annapolis Police Department JOINS Program.
