In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 83 calls for service and arrested 5 people.

Hit and Run Accident – 201400001554 – Forest Dr at Tyler Av – 03/31 at 11:19am: A Ford Explorer struck an electrical pole near the intersection, shearing the pole from the ground. The driver of the Explorer fled in the vehicle. Officers located the vehicle parked and unoccupied on Rosecrest Dr near Roselawn Dr. An observant citizen reported seeing a man leaving the area and officers located the driver and arrested him. The driver was identified as Shane Michael, 24, of Edgewater. Michael was arrested and charged with leaving the scene of an accident and driving while revoked. The accident left power lines hanging across the intersection and both Forest Dr and Tyler Av were impassable. BG&E responded quickly to the scene to make the necessary repairs. BG&E finished replacing the pole and reattaching the electric lines at 3am. Verizon and Comcast finished their repairs by 4:35am and the roadway was reopened.
