

# Daily Report 07/25/14

**In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 130 calls for service and arrested 10 people.**

**Theft from Vehicle** – 201400003712 – 200 block of Prince George St – 07/24 from 6:30pm to 11:05pm: A white and gold Apple iPhone 5 was stolen from an apparently unlocked vehicle.

**Theft from Vehicle** – 201400003715 – 200 block of Annapolis St – 07/25 at 3:19am: An observant citizen called the police after seeing a man trying vehicle door handles. Officers arrived and discovered John Schwallenberg, 31, of Lothian near a pick up truck with a cap over the rear bed. The rear window to the locked cap was smashed and tools stored in the rear bed had been moved to the passenger compartment. A pair of sunglasses and a Mercedes bag, not belonging to the truck owner, were recovered in the rear bed. A prescription bottle with Schwallenberg's name on it was found on the hood of another vehicle in the area. This vehicle's owner was located and he said a pair of glasses, his vehicle manual, and money were stolen from the unlocked vehicle. The vehicle manual was located inside the pick up truck and the glasses were located on the front door steps of a home in the 200 block of Annapolis St. Schwallenberg was arrested and will be charged with multiple counts of theft and rogue and vagabond, and destruction of property. Schwallenberg was charged in the early hours of 07/25 with a theft and rogue and vagabond that occurred on 07/24 by an Anne Arundel County police officer. He was released by the District Court Commissioner on those charges.

**Attempted Theft from Vehicle** – 201400003716 – 1500 block of Ritchie La – 07/25 at 4:51am: A citizen was driving by when he saw three people running from the area. He called his wife to have her check her vehicle which was parked on Ritchie La. Items were removed from the unlocked vehicle, but they were located on the ground next to the vehicle and nothing was stolen.
