

Daily Report 09/08/14

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 340 calls for service and arrested 35 people.

Shots Fired – 201400004414 and 4486 – 1100 block of Frederick Douglass St – 08/31 at 11pm to 09/06 at 9:30am: Two homes were struck by bullets, but is not clear when the damage occurred. In one home a bullet appeared to strike the front window and exited a rear window, causing a small hole in each window. In the other home a bullet appeared to strike an upstairs window frame. No one was injured in either home.

Stolen/Recovered Vehicle – 201400004468 – 1700 block of West St – 09/04 at 11:15pm to 09/05 at 7am: A 2013 Hyundai was stolen from a dealership parking lot when the keys were left inside the vehicle. Anne Arundel County Police Department recovered the vehicle before it was reported stolen. They found the vehicle parked and unoccupied in the 1400 block of Dorsey Rd.

Stolen/Recovered Vehicle – 201400004478 – 1300 block of Tyler Av – 09/05 at 10:50pm: The vehicle owner reported her 2005 Cadillac was stolen when she left her vehicle parked with the keys in the ignition. She saw a man get in the vehicle and drive off. Officers located the vehicle in the area and the driver initially failed to stop. The driver exited the vehicle and was arrested by officers. Brandon Travis, 33, of Annapolis was charged with motor vehicle theft and numerous traffic offenses including driving while revoked and suspended. Travis is being held on \$5,000 bond at the Jennifer Road Detention Center.

Robbery – 201400004483 – 1000 block of Madison St – 09/06 at 3am: The adult male victim was asleep on the front steps of the building when he awoke to a male subject removing his shoe. When the victim asked the suspect what he was doing the suspect slapped the victim and ran off. The suspect stole a black shoe, money, and a black Metro PCS cell phone.

Stolen/Recovered Bicycle – 201400004509 – 1200 block of Youngs Farm Rd – 09/07 at 2pm: The bicycle owner witnessed two males steal his bicycle from the front porch of his home. Officers checking the area saw the bicycle being ridden in the 1400 block of Tyler Av. They lost sight of the bicycle, but later found it abandoned behind a dumpster. The bicycle was returned to the owner.
