

Daily Report 09/17/14

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 108 calls for service and arrested 9 people.

Good News – On 09/16 Detectives from the Annapolis Police Department arrested Vernell Williams, 23, of Annapolis for the shooting that occurred on 09/15 at the outdoor basketball courts near the “Pip” Moyer Recreation Center. Williams was charged with attempted first and second degree murder, first and second degree assault, reckless endangerment, possession of a handgun in a felony or violent crime, and handgun on person. Williams is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center without bond.

Stolen and Recovered Bicycle – 201400004672 – Unit block of Hudson St – Prior to 08/11: A Huffly beach cruiser style bicycle was stolen from the business some time prior to 08/11. The bicycle was part of a loaner program, but was not returned. An employee saw the bicycle at Fast Cash Pawn Shop on West St and called the police. The bicycle was returned to the owner.

Burglary – 201400004677 – 100 block of Acton Rd – 09/15 at 1pm to 09/16 at 12:01pm: The rear door to the home was forced open and jewelry was stolen.

USNA Gate 1 and 3 Traffic Impacted for Next Three Weeks

Due to emergency repairs to a high-temperature hot water line at the United States Naval Academy, inbound and outbound traffic at Gate 1 and Gate 3 will be affected for the next three weeks.

Repair of the line will start on September 18 and is expected to take approximately three weeks and during that time, the normal inbound lanes at USNA’s Gate 1, located at the corner of King George Street and Randall Street, will be closed. Meanwhile, the outbound lanes will be used for inbound traffic from 6-9 a.m.

All other times, Gate 1 will accommodate only outbound traffic.

Maryland Avenue from King George Street to Hanover Street, near Gate 3, will also be affected. Both lanes will be inbound only Monday through Sunday for the next three weeks.
