

Daily Report 09/30/14

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 94 calls for service and arrested 12 people.

Good News – The Annapolis Police Department collected 94lbs of unwanted medications during the National Take-Back Initiative on Saturday, September 27. These medications will be disposed of properly preventing possible poisoning of children and pets, deterring misuse, and keeping medicines from entering streams and rivers if disposed of down a drain.

Theft of Bicycle – 201400004837 – 7000 block of Bembe Beach Rd – 09/22 at 7pm to 09/23 at 8am: A men's Cube County Lite System hybrid style bicycle was stolen from a bike rack. The bicycle was secured with a chain which was cut.

UPDATE Attempted Homicide/Suicide – 201400004897 – 1100 block of Madison St – 09/29 at 7:40am: Officers received a call for a shooting in an apartment. Upon arrival officers located Arthurdella Harris, 49, and Tony Smith, 54, suffering from gun shot wounds. Harris and Smith were flown to Baltimore Shock Trauma. Smith later died from his injuries. Harris and Smith lived together in the apartment where the shooting occurred and were in a long term relationship. No one else was in the apartment at the time of the shooting. After initial investigation it appears Smith shot Harris twice and then shot himself.
