

Daily Report 10/31/14

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 85 calls for service and arrested 4 people.

Burglary – 201400005418 – 200 block of Georgetown Rd – 10/30 from 9am to 4pm: A black Toshiba laptop computer was stolen from an unlocked home.

CORRECTIONS Bicycle Accident – 201400005419 – Spa Rd at Hilltop La – 10/30 at 4:54pm: Two 13 year old males and one 14 year old male two on foot and one on a bicycle were struck by a vehicle. Two juveniles were transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center and one was transported to Johns Hopkins Hospital, all had non-life threatening injuries. The driver involved assisted with the investigation. Initial investigation suggests bicycle operator and pedestrian errors were contributing factors.

Recovered/Stolen Vehicle – 201400005422 – 1200 block of Forest Dr – 10/30 at 6:12pm: A Chevrolet Impala was stolen from a gas station when the operator left the vehicle with the keys inside. The operator saw the vehicle being taken and then flagged down a passing police officer. Officers searched for and located the unoccupied vehicle in the 900 block of Bethany Ct. The stolen vehicle struck a parked vehicle before it was abandoned. Officers located a 37 year old woman from New Jersey in the area and the victim identified her as the suspect who stole the vehicle. The woman was arrested, but later transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center for medical reasons. Charges are pending.

Shots Fired – 201400005423 – Town Pines Ct at Clay St – 10/30 at 6:52pm: Officers responded to the area for reports of shots fired. They located shell casings in the area and three homes on Clay St were struck by bullets. Two of the homes were empty at the time they were struck. In the third home, two residents were in an upstairs room when a round entered. Neither resident was struck.

Pedestrian Accident – 201400005424 – Route 665 at Chinquapin Round Rd – 10/30 at 8:12pm: The adult male pedestrian was crossing Route 665 at Chinquapin Round Rd when he was struck by at least one vehicle. The pedestrian suffered life threatening injuries and was flown to Baltimore Shock Trauma. The drivers involved assisted with the investigation. Initial investigation suggests pedestrian error was a contributing factor.

Armed Robbery – 201400005425 – 400 block of Oaklawn Av – 10/31 at 2:18pm: An adult male was the passenger in a vehicle, when the driver stopped for the suspect standing in the roadway. The suspect asked the passenger for money and the passenger refused. The suspect implied he had a gun on his hip and the passenger gave him money. Officers checked the area and located the suspect, later identified as Orlando Foote, 52, of Annapolis, in the unit block of Carver St. Foote was arrested and charged with armed robbery and theft and is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center without bond.

Halloween Safety Tips

Be sure to show your children how to cross a street properly. They should always look both ways before crossing the street and should only cross at corners or crosswalks. Make sure if you have more than one child, they know to take the hand of a younger child when they cross the street.

Teach kids about not getting into a stranger's car, going into a stranger's home, or even talking to strangers.

Help your child pick out or make a costume that will be safe. Make sure that it is fire proof or treated with fire retardant. If they are wearing a mask of any kind, make sure that the eye holes are large enough for good peripheral vision. Make sure that if your child is carrying a prop that the tips are smooth and flexible enough to not cause injury. Make sure that costumes won't get in the way when they are walking, causing them to trip.

Make sure you set a time your kids should be home. Make sure they know how important it is for them to be home on time or call immediately if something happens and they are going to be delayed.

Know the route your kids will be taking if you aren't going with them. Have them check in with you every hour, by phone or by stopping back home. Make sure that they know not to deviate from the planned route so that you always know where they will be. Your best bet is to make sure that an adult is going with them. If you can't take them yourself, see if another parent or two can.
