

Daily Report 10/06/14

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 318 calls for service and arrested 25 people.

Good News – Over \$6,000 was raised to help the athletes of Special Olympics. Despite the rain and flooding the 5th Annual Annapolis Police Department One Mile Challenge held on Saturday, October 4th was a success for Special Olympics Maryland. Armed Robbery – 201400004987 – 1300 block of Tyler Av – 10/03 at 9:30pm: The adult male victim was walking past a group of two or three juvenile males when one of them placed him in a chokehold. The victim assumed they were joking until he heard a gun cock and they demanded money. The victim was struck in the head with the gun and money, prescription medication, and cigarettes were stolen from his pockets. The suspects let him go and then fled on foot down Tyler Av.

Shots Fired – 201400004994 – 1100 block of Frederick Douglass St – 10/04 at 1:35pm: Officers responded for calls reporting shots fired. Officers located shell casings on the ground in the area, but no victims were found.

Theft of Bicycle/Recovered – 201400004995 – 200 block of West St – 10/04 from 1pm to 1:11pm: The unsecured bicycle was left in front of a business when it was stolen. The bicycle was returned to the owner the next day by a subject who thought the bicycle had been left there as free to take.

Burglary – 201400005011 – 800 block of Janice Dr – 10/04 at 8am to 10/05 at 2:15am: The rear door to the home was forced open and a fire safe lock box, jewelry, money, and several watches were stolen.

Burglary – 201400005015 – 400 block of Third St – 10/5 from 4:30pm to 5:30pm: Money was stolen after the home was entered through an unlocked rear door.
