

Daily Report 10/14/14

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 73 calls for service and arrested 11 people.

Good News – On 10/13 Detectives from the Annapolis Police Department arrested Colando Colbert, 19, of Annapolis for the armed robbery that occurred on 10/03 in the 1300 block of Tyler Av. The adult male victim was walking past a group of two or three juvenile males when one of them placed him in a chokehold. The victim assumed they were joking until he heard a gun cock and they demanded money. The victim was struck in the head with the gun and money, prescription medication, and cigarettes were stolen from his pockets. The suspects let him go and then fled on foot down Tyler Av. Detectives were able to identify Colbert as a suspect in the robbery and charged him with armed robbery, robbery, first and second degree assault, use of firearm in a felony or violent crime, theft, and possession of CDS. Colbert is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center without bond.

There are no preventable Part One offenses to report this morning. Part One offenses are those incidents we report to the MD State Police and the F.B.I. These incidents include homicides, robberies, burglaries, rapes, serious assaults, and thefts.
