

Daily Report 10/30/14

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 93 calls for service and arrested 6 people.

Located Critically Missing Adult – 201400005405 – 300 block of Rogers Heights Rd – 10/29 at 12:01pm: Natalie Finkle, 51, of Annapolis left her home and did not return as expected. Family members reported details to police which made Ms. Finkle a critically missing person. Ms. Finkle was located later the same evening, safe and unharmed.

Robbery – 201400005413 – 200 block of Old Solomons Island Rd – 10/29 at 7:30pm: The adult female victim was walking in the area when she noticed three male subjects following her. The subjects grabbed her from behind and tried to take a black bag she was carrying. When she refused to let go of the bag, the subjects punched her in the head. The victim lost consciousness and her bag, containing a few coins and a bottle of water, was stolen. After the victim awoke a passing citizen took her to Anne Arundel Medical Center, at which point the police were called.

Halloween Safety Tips

Be sure to show your children how to cross a street properly. They should always look both ways before crossing the street and should only cross at corners or crosswalks. Make sure if you have more than one child, they know to take the hand of a younger child when they cross the street.

Teach kids about not getting into a stranger's car, going into a stranger's home, or even talking to strangers.

Help your child pick out or make a costume that will be safe. Make sure that it is fire proof or treated with fire retardant. If they are wearing a mask of any kind, make sure that the eye holes are large enough for good peripheral vision. Make sure that if your child is carrying a prop that the tips are smooth and flexible enough to not cause injury. Make sure that costumes won't get in the way when they are walking, causing them to trip.

Make sure you set a time your kids should be home. Make sure they know how important it is for them to be home on time or call immediately if something happens and they are going to be delayed.

Know the route your kids will be taking if you aren't going with them. Have them check in with you every hour, by phone or by stopping back home. Make sure that they know not to deviate from the planned route so that you always know where they will be. Your best bet is to make sure that an adult is going with them. If you can't take them yourself, see if another parent or two can.
