In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 114 calls for service and arrested 10 people.

Good News – On 08/07 Demarcus Gross, 18, of Annapolis turned himself into the Annapolis Department. Gross was arrested for his part in the robberies that occurred on 07/21 in the unit block of Franklin St.

Burglary – 201400003956 – 200 Janwall St – 07/24 at 3pm to 07/28 at 8am: After entering Tyler Heights Elementary School through an unlocked ground floor window money was stolen from a vending machine.

Theft from Vehicle – 201400003957 – 200 block of Norwood Rd – 08/05 at 9:30pm to 08/06 at 10:45am: The front passenger window of the vehicle was shattered and a black leather purse was stolen from the front passenger seat. The purse was found on top of a neighbor's vehicle with the money removed.
