

Daily Report 08/18/14

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 331 calls for service and arrested 37 people.

Good News – On Sunday, August 17 officers from the Annapolis Police Department and Anne Arundel Community College participated in Cops on Rooftops at Dunkin Donuts to benefit Special Olympics Maryland. Athletes and officers collected \$1,677 in donations to present to Special Olympics. Thank you to all who gave a donation and to everyone who helped with the event.

Burglary – 201400004117 – 1700 block of West St – 08/14 at 9pm to 08/15 at 6:30am: The fence securing a rear storage lot was cut and four wheels and tires were stolen from a vehicle.

Theft from Vehicle – 201400004118 – 1000 block of Cedar Ridge Ct – 08/14 at 8pm to 08/15 at 8:20am: A black Motorola Android cell phone and keys were stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

A Cannondale mountain bicycle was also taken from the garage, but left in the rear yard of the residence. On 08/17 at 2am officers were checking the area of Pearson Pt and Banneker Pl when they saw three juvenile males in the area. One of the juveniles, a 16 year old from Annapolis, was identified as a suspect in the burglary. He was charged with burglary, theft, and rogue and vagabond and transported to Cheltenham Youth Facility.

Theft from Vehicle – 201400004122 – 700 block of Childs Point Rd – 08/15 from 4am to 5am: Money was stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

Attempted Burglary – 201400004131 – Unit block of College Av – 07/15 at 7am to 08/10 at 6pm: Someone attempted to force open the rear door to the home. The home was not entered.

Burglary – 201400004142 – Unit block of Church Cir – 08/15 at 8pm to 08/16 at 6:30am: The cash register for the business was forced open and money was stolen. There were no signs of forced entry to the building.

Attempted Theft from Vehicle – 201400004147 – 700 block of Crisfield Way – 08/14 at 9pm to 08/15 at 9am: An unlocked vehicle was entered, but nothing was stolen.

Burglary – 201400004165 – 400 block of Oaklawn Av – 08/17 at 2:19pm: An observant citizen saw a juvenile male taking a bicycle from an open garage and riding away on it. The citizen alerted the bicycle owner and about 15 minutes later they saw the same juvenile male walking in

the area. The juvenile ran when they confronted him and they called the police. Officers located the 16 year old boy from Annapolis and charged him with burglary and theft. He was released to his guardian. The stolen bicycle was found behind the juvenile's home and returned to the owner.

Theft of Kayak – 201400004167 – 700 block of Fairview Av – 08/14 to 08/15: A camouflage colored 2012 Field and Stream 12' Eagle Run kayak was stolen from a kayak rack.
