

Daily Report 08/29/14

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 101 calls for service and arrested 11 people.

Good News – On 08/27 at 2:30am an observant citizen in the 900 block of Awald Rd saw a man looking into vehicles in the parking lot. The man opened the door to the citizen's unlocked vehicle and the alarm began sounding. The man ran off, but officers located him in the 900 block of Bay Ridge Rd. He was identified as Randy Forgette, 40, of Annapolis. Forgette was arrested and charged with one count of rogue and vagabond on a criminal citation and released.

Stolen and Recovered Bicycle – 201400004310 – 1200 block of Madison St - 08/24 at 12:01am to 08/26 at 1pm: A blue Magna bicycle was stolen from an open patio area. On 08/28 at 10pm officers found the bicycle abandoned in the 1200 block of Ashton Ct. The bicycle was returned to the owner.

Burglary – 201400004326 – 900 block of Windsor Av – 08/27 at 11pm to 08/28 at 8:15am: A green Lowepro camera bag and a black Canon camera bag were stolen from a detached garage. The bags contained three Canon camera lenses, four Canon flashes, a Photogenic PowerLight monolight, and seven memory cards. The items stolen are worth over \$9,800. An ineffective door lock may have been forced open to gain entry.
