

Daily Report 12/11/14

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 106 calls for service and arrested 17 people.

Burglary – 201400006001 – Unit block of East St – 12/10 at 6:20am: After entering the home through the unlocked front door an Apple MacBook Air and a Samsung Galaxy cell phone were stolen. Residents were home and asleep when the burglary occurred. One resident awoke and saw two suspects wearing dark clothing and carrying a flashlight inside the home. The resident pretended to remain asleep while the suspects exited the home. Residents waited approximately 40 minutes to report the burglary to the police.

Theft from Vehicle – 201400006002 – 100 block of Prince George St – 12/10 from 3:30am to 8am: Money was stolen from an apparently unlocked vehicle.

Burglary – 201400006004 – 600 block of Severn Island Ct – 12/10 at 10:10am: A caller told police that they saw two Hispanic males entering a vacant home in the area. Upon arrival officers located seven people inside, two 16 year old males, two 16 year old females, two 17 year old males, and Jennifer Rivera-Lopez, 18, all of Annapolis. All six juveniles were given juvenile citations for third and fourth degree burglary, four were released to their guardians, and a 16 year old male and a 17 year old male were transported to Cheltenham Youth Facility. Rivera-Lopez was charged with third and fourth degree burglary and released on her own recognizance by the District Court Commissioner.

Stolen Vehicle – 201400006005 – 100 block of Main St – 12/09 at 9:30pm to 12/10 at 10am: A blue 2005 Toyota Highlander, MD reg. 51747CA, was stolen after it was parked on Main St.

Burglary – 201400006007 – 900 block of Madison St – 12/10 from 1:30pm to 3pm: The front door to the home was forced open and a Sony PlayStation 3 game console was stolen.
