

Daily Report 12/22/14

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 262 calls for service and arrested 16 people.

Burglary – 201400006132 – Unit block of McKendree Av – 12/18 at 1pm: The home was entered through an unlocked door and money was stolen.

Assault – 201400006141 – 1300 block of Tyler Av – 12/19 at 7:40pm: Officers responded to the area for a report of shots fired. When they arrived an adult female victim reported that she and her boyfriend, Cecil Wiggins, 48, of Annapolis, had been arguing most of the day. Wiggins left the victim's home and when he returned he began kicking the front door to get inside. The victim was outside the home and fled to the rear door to get into the home. Wiggins confronted her at the rear door with a handgun. With the help of her juvenile son, the victim got inside the home while Wiggins was also trying to enter. The victim was trying to close the rear door, when Wiggins fired a shot through the gap in the door. The round struck the ceiling of the kitchen. Wiggins fled the area before officers arrived, but was located and arrested. The gun was also recovered. Wiggins was charged with two counts of first degree assault, second degree assault, first degree burglary, two counts of reckless endangerment, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, and handgun on person. Wiggins is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$150,000 bond.

Burglary – 201400006143 – 1400 block of Hunting Wood Rd – 12/19 from 7pm to 9:45pm: The rear door to the home was forced open and an HP Pavilion laptop computer and jewelry were stolen.

Stolen Vehicle – 201400006145 – 400 block of Jefferson St – 12/20 from 2:30am to 9am: A dark blue 1999 Chevrolet Tahoe, MD reg. 3BH3103, was stolen when it was left unlocked with a spare key inside.

Theft of Package – 201400006149 – 200 block of Taylor Av – 12/19 from 10:18pm to 10:30pm: An Amazon package was stolen from the front porch.

Attempted Burglary – 201400006168 – 1900 block of Lincoln Dr – 12/20 at 10pm to 12/21 at 7:45pm: An unknown suspect tried to pry open the front door to the business. It does not appear the business was entered.

Robbery – 201400006170 – 1000 block of Monroe St – 12/21 at 8:30pm: An adult male entered the business, approached the cash register, and demanded money. The man implied he had a weapon by reaching for his side and lifting up his jacket. The man stole money and fled the area on foot.

Holiday Crime Prevention Tips

Burglars view the holidays as an opportunity to steal cash, credit cards, and gifts from your home. To help prevent burglaries make sure your doors and windows are locked, even if you are

leaving for just a few minutes. Make sure you don't have a spare key to your home that is easily accessible to burglars. If you are going to be away during the holidays have your mail held, have a neighbor check on your house, and put lights on timers to turn on and off automatically. After the holidays avoid putting empty boxes from your new computer, game console, etc out on the curb for pick up. If possible, break down the boxes and put them inside your recycling container.
