

Daily Report 11/25/14

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 107 calls for service and arrested 11 people.

Recovered Stolen Bicycle – 201400003972 – 1900 block of West St – 11/24 at 4:30pm: A citizen saw a man riding his stolen bicycle and called the police. The bicycle was stolen in August from the open garage of a home in the 200 block of Locust Av. Officers arrived and arrested the man riding the bicycle, Raymond Sheriff, 52, of Annapolis. Sheriff was charged with second degree burglary and theft. He was released by the District Court Commissioner on his own recognizance.

Shots Fired – 201400005795 – 1900 block of Copeland St – 11/24 at 5:37pm: Officers responded to the area for reports of shots fired. Before the shots were heard, residents reported a group of 15-20 male subjects were arguing in the area. Officers searched the area for the subjects and found shell casings.

Burglary – 201400005798 – 900 block of Monroe St – 11/20 at 12:01pm to 11/21 at 9am: A pair of orange and grey Skull Candy headphones, a black OontZ Angle portable Bluetooth speaker, and black Dragon sunglasses were stolen when the home was left unlocked.

Shooting – 201400005800 – 1300 block of Tyler Av – 11/24 at 11:40pm: Officers responded to the area for reports of shots fired. Officers located a 20 year old man from Annapolis leaving the community who had a non-penetrating injury from a bullet to his arm. The man was treated for his injury on scene. Through investigation a suspect was identified, located, and arrested. The suspect is a 27 year old man from Severn. He is at Annapolis Police Headquarters awaiting transport to the District Court Commissioner to be seen on his charges. The handgun used in this crime was not recovered. Two homes and a vehicle were also struck by gunfire.
