In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 113 calls for service and arrested 15 people.

Armed Robbery – 201400000719 – 1900 block of Fairfax Rd – 02/11 at 1:30pm: A man entered the business, jumped over the counter, and threatened the employee with a box cutter. The man took money from the business and ran out the rear door.

Mr. Turner, also known as Peppy, left Summerfield Dr to attend church at Asbury United Methodist Church at 87 West St. Mr. Turner was wearing a black suit, red dress shirt, and a red tie. He is known to frequent downtown Annapolis, the Festival at Riva shopping center, and the Harbour House community.
