#### **SENIOR CITIZENS**

Senior citizens 60 years and older can ride for approximately one-half the regular fare on regular bus service for a one-way trip. The one way Senior Reduced Fare on local regular services is one-half the regular fare. A senior citizen Day, Weekly and Monthly Passes are also available for one-half of the regular price of these passes. These passes allow for unlimited rides on all regular bus routes. For all Reduced Fare Program purchases, the customer must be able to prove that he or she is eligible as noted above.

#### *Eligibility:*

##### (a) Senior Reduced Fares:

Senior citizens (age 60 and over) must show:

- any valid government issued photo ID with proof of age, OR
- a Medicare card and any valid government issued photo ID

Annapolis Transit Senior Photo ID cards are no longer issued by Annapolis Department of Transportation. Seniors (60 and over) may apply for a Maryland Photo Identification Card at any Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration Office. There is no fee.

#### **DISABLED**

To ride Annapolis Transit services (excluding paratransit) with the Disability discount, the following is required:

- a valid Annapolis Transit Reduced Fare Disability photo ID card, OR
- a valid disability ID from another transit agency and any valid government issued photo ID, OR
- for individuals UNDER age 60, and a Medicare card holder and any valid government issued photo ID

The one way Disabled Reduced Fare on local regular services is one-half the regular fare. Reduced Day, Weekly and Monthly Passes are also available for one-half of the regular price of these passes. These passes allow for unlimited rides on all regular bus routes. For all Reduced Fare Program purchases, the customer must be able to prove that he or she is eligible as noted above.

## **STUDENTS**

A student with a valid school-issued photo identification card can ride for approximately one-half the regular fare on regular bus service for a one-way trip. The Student ID card is issued to students by parochial, private and public schools in the City of Annapolis and Anne Arundel County. Students enrolled in area colleges including the Naval Academy may also be eligible for similar discounts.

The one way Student Reduced Fare on local regular services is one-half the regular fare. Reduced Day, Weekly and Monthly Passes are also available for one-half the regular price. These passes allow for unlimited rides on all regular bus routes. For all Reduced Fare Program purchases, the customer must be able to prove that he or she is eligible as noted above.

You can use the Student ID card to pay for a Student Fare on all Annapolis Transit regular bus services.

### *Rules for Discounted Student Fare:*

- Present your ID card each time you pay for an Annapolis Transit Student Fare.
- The ID card is valid only for the school term printed on it
- Your ID card must have your name, address, gender, the name of your school, and the date it was issued to you printed on the front. ID cards without this information will not be accepted as valid and you will be required to pay the full fare to travel.
- Student fares are applicable on Saturdays, Sundays or holidays.
