16 **A RESOLUTION** concerning

18 **Eastport and Forest Drive Communities and Governmental Agencies Task Force**

20 **FOR** the purpose of extending the term of the temporary advisory Task Force commissioned to
21 provide the Mayor and City Council with a public forum to study and prepare reports about
22 the Forest Drive/Eastport Sector Study.

25 **WHEREAS,** the City Council introduced R-45-18 on September 24, 2018, for the purpose of
26 adopting the Forest Drive/Eastport Sector Study as an addendum to the 2009
27 Annapolis Comprehensive Plan; and

28
29 **WHEREAS,** on January 28, and February 22, 2019, the City Council held public hearings on R-
30 45-18, and heard many citizens voice their concerns about the Forest Drive/Eastport
31 Sector Study as presented, and many residents provided their concerns in writing
32 to elected officials; and

33
34 **WHEREAS,** on March 26, 2019, the City Council moved to refer the Forest Drive/Eastport
35 Sector Study back to the Planning Commission, and to the Standing Committees
36 for further study and to receive public input; and

37
38 **WHEREAS,** on July 22, 2019, the City Council adopted R-27-19, which established a temporary
39 advisory Task Force to further study and receive public input concerning the Forest
40 Drive/Eastport Sector Study as requested by concerned and impacted residents; the
41 amendments of the Council Standing Committees and the official record of R-45-
42 18; and if they wish, to allow residents the opportunity to provide related input
43 regarding the 2020 Comprehensive Plan; and

45 **WHEREAS,** the City Council wishes to extend the term of the temporary advisory Task Force
46 to May 31, 2020, in order for the Task Force to complete its mission.

3 **NOW, THEREFORE,**
4

5 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL** that the Eastport and Forest
6 Drive Communities and Governmental Agencies Task Force term is extended to May 31, 2020.

8 **AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL** that the
9 formation and function of the Eastport and Forest Drive Communities and Governmental Agencies
10 Task Force is restated as follows:
11

- 12 1. There may not be more than 21 members on the Task Force.
- 13 2. The Task Force members shall serve without compensation.
- 14 3. The Task Force members shall elect from among their membership a chair, vice chair and
15 secretary.
- 16 4. Membership of the Task Force shall represent each ward and there shall be one member
17 who resides in Anne Arundel County on the Annapolis Neck Peninsula who shall represent
18 the interests of the Annapolis Neck Peninsula residents.
- 19 5. The Director of Planning and Zoning, or a designee, shall be a member of the Task Force.
- 20 6. Arundel County and the State of Maryland will be asked to provide support staff to assist
21 the Task Force, and to the extent practicable, may designate up to 3 representatives from
22 each entity to serve on the task force.
- 23 7. The Task Force shall meet publicly at least quarterly and shall take testimony from the
24 public at each meeting.
- 25 8. The Task Force shall work with the appropriate alderpersons to maximize community
26 testimony and dialog at the Task Force meetings.
- 27 9. The Task Force shall consult with and obtain input from the County and State
28 representatives related to land use planning and mobility issues.
- 29 10. The Task Force shall review the traffic projections provided in the Sector Study and
30 determine whether additional forecasts are, or information is, needed.
- 31 11. The Task Force shall make recommendations on any new or adjusted short term solutions
32 offered in the Sector Study or Comprehensive Plan after receiving comments from the
33 public, the County, and State representatives.
- 34 12. The Task Force may adopt bylaws and rules of procedure as it deems necessary and
35 desirable for the conduct of its meetings and activities.
- 36 13. Findings and recommendations of the Task Force shall be submitted publicly in a quarterly
37 report to the Mayor and City Council.
- 38 14. The chair, vice chair and secretary shall ensure that the business of the Task Force shall be
39 conducted consistent with the provisions of the Maryland Open Meetings Act and Robert's
40 Rules of Order (11th Edition).
- 41 15. The Task Force shall have no authority to render public decisions or opinions, or accept
42 complaints, or act as a mediator to resolve disagreements.
- 43 16. If there are any actual or perceived conflicts between the Task Force and the Planning
44 Commission, the Task Force shall seek to resolve them, or report on the differences.
- 45 17. The term of the Task Force shall end May 31, 2020, unless the City Council takes further
46 action to extend such term.
