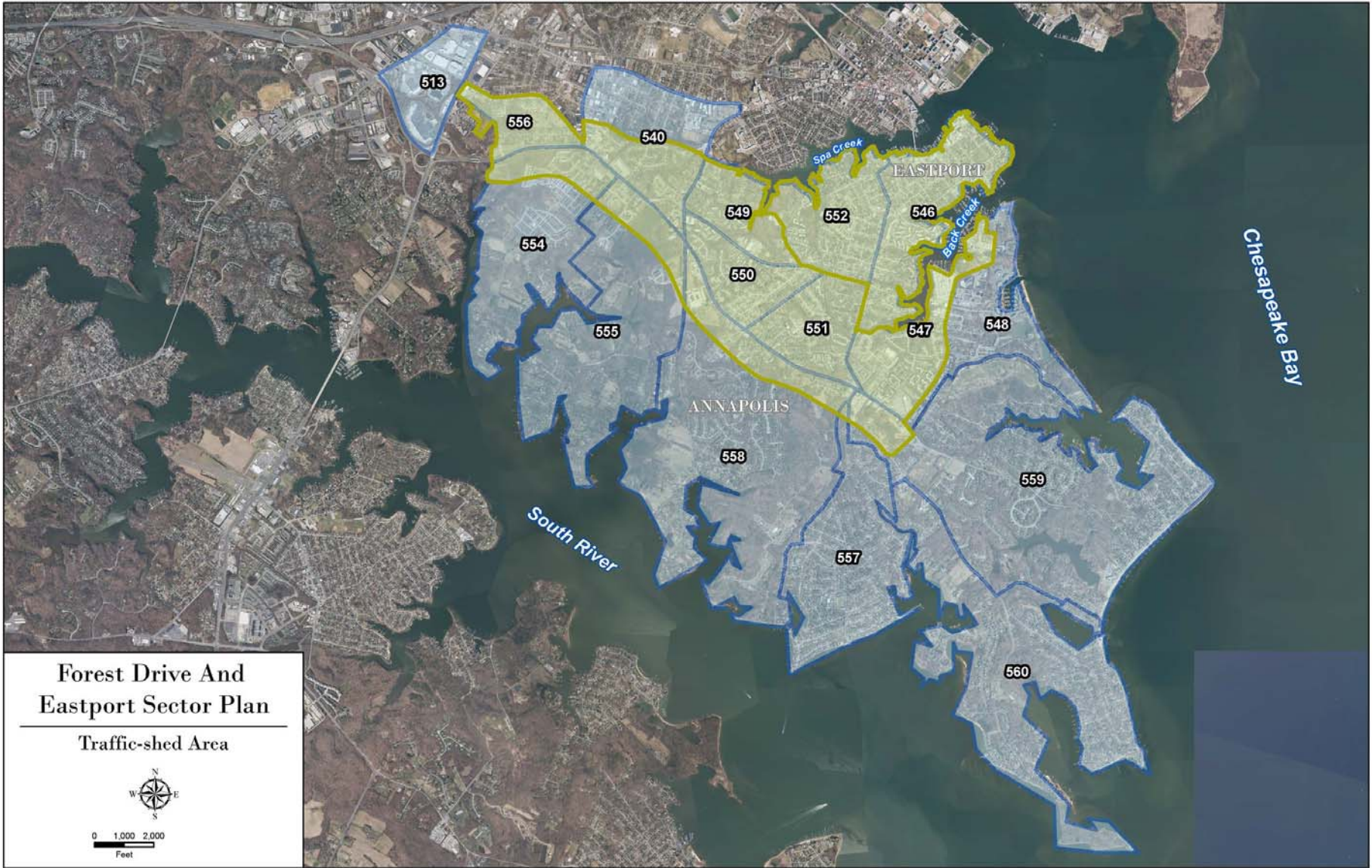

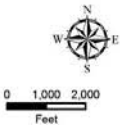
Step One: Identify the Issues

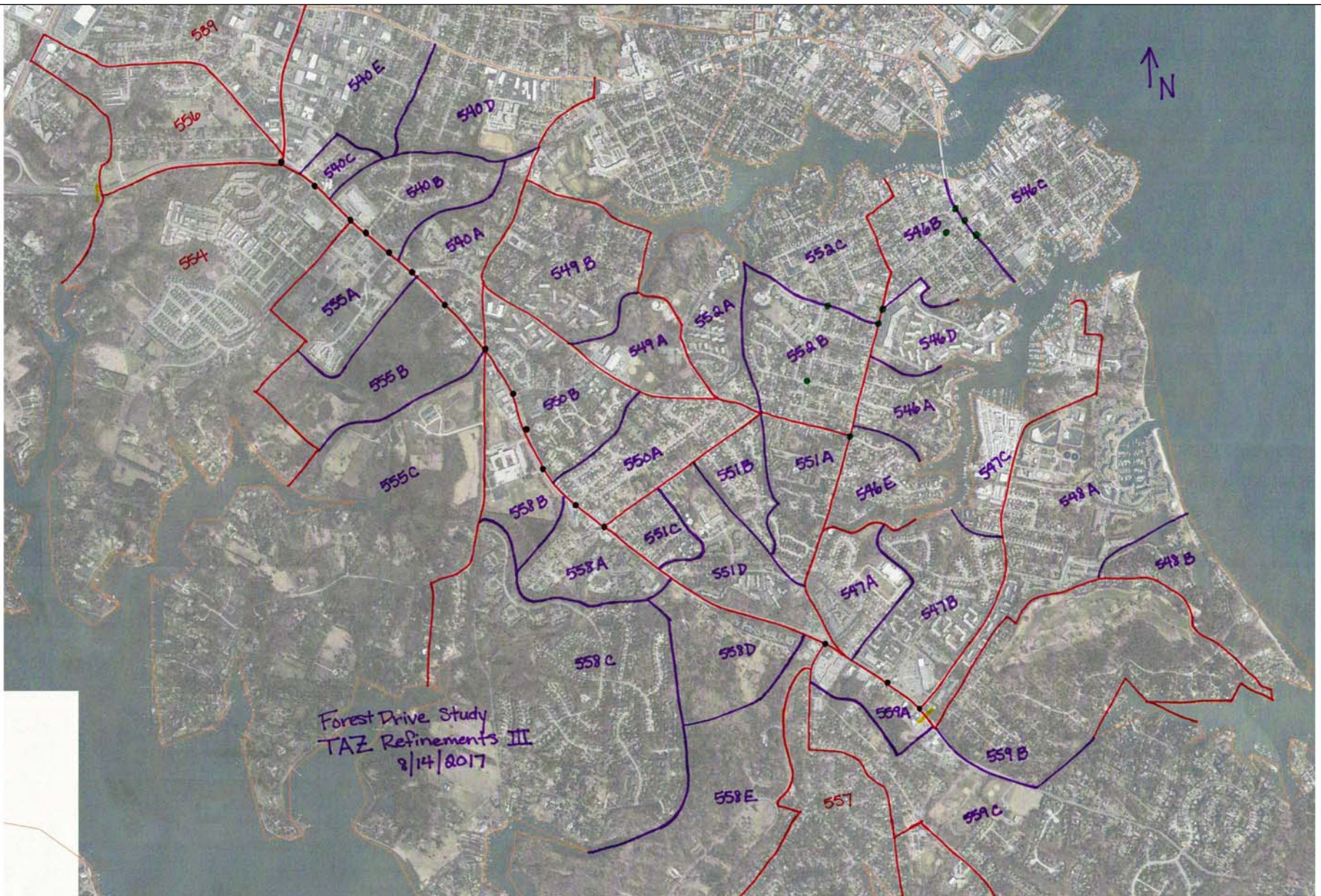
- ❑ Stakeholder meetings July 11-20th (Mobility meeting July 13th)

Early Analysis of Survey Results

- ❑ ~Two-thirds of 924 respondents live in study area (400 near Forest Drive, 190 in Eastport)
- ❑ Top choice for “If you live along Forest Drive or Eastport, what attracted you to this area?” is proximity to downtown
- ❑ Biggest problem is traffic – 70% say an issue on a day-to-day basis and when there is an accident. Another 30% say it’s hard to get around without a car
- ❑ Most important for sector study to focus on: Transportation (68%), Land Use (65%)
- ❑ Responses to open-ended question, “What do you wish was located along Forest Drive or in Eastport?” varied: Bike lanes – 66, Improved roads – 15, Improved signaling – 13, Less traffic/congestion – 55, Pedestrian safety – 25, Transit – 11. Most popular “Nothing else” or “Wegmans” followed by “Trader Joe’s” and “Wawa.”



Next Steps

- Step Two: Identify Policies and Actions Based on Input (Oct.-Dec. 2017)
- Step Three: Confirm Policies and Possible Solutions (Jan.-Feb. 2018)
- Step Four: Draft Document—Did We Get It Right? (Feb.-April 2018)
- Step Five: Plan Adoption Process (April-Sep. 2018)
